World Scout Bureau Opens New Office in Kuala Lumpur: A testimony of the Movement's growth and diversity worldwide

The World Scout Bureau unveiled its new office in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia which will serve as a shared service centre for the global operations of the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM).

The fully-operational office has the capacity to host 30 staff members from multiple nationalities, who will support the 162 National Scout Organizations which are members of WOSM.

The new office was opened by the Honourable Prime Minister of Malaysia, Dato' Sri Mohd Najib bin Tun Abdul Razak. Also present were the Honourable Vice President of the Republic of Philippines, Jejomar Binay, and representatives of the World Scout Committee.

In his speech, Secretary General of WOSM, Scott Teare, said: "I am pleasantly surprised by how welcoming, diverse and vibrant Kuala Lumpur is. With every trip, I could not resist making the connection between the World Scout Movement and Kuala Lumpur. Both the city and the Movement embody a unique representation of modern life, driven by young people who are engaged and animated by strong values."

With the new office in Kuala Lumpur, the World Scout Bureau's global network of offices has expanded to eight locations worldwide – Brussels, Cairo, Geneva, Kiev, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Nairobi and Panama City – thus allowing the World Scout Movement to be as close as possible to the National Scout Organizations. The legal seat of the World Organization of Scout Movement remains in Geneva, Switzerland.

"The Scout Movement is a volunteer-based movement and volunteers are the lifeblood of the organization. We need more people to step up, especially adult volunteers, to ensure that we grow this vibrant movement from 40 million members today to over 100 million members within the next 10 years," said Teare.

The Secretary General also extended appreciation to the Government of Malaysia, the Scout Association of Malaysia, and the World Scout Foundation as "without their support, we would not have been able to set up this new office here in Kuala Lumpur".

Environmental Education: An essential focus for Scouting

Scouts Australia hosted the fourth series of APR Environment Education workshop on 2-5 June at the invigorating Woodhouse Activity Centre in Adelaide.

Giving importance to environment education as an integral part of the Scout program, this workshop also marked the World Environment Day on the 5th of June. Similar gatherings were held in Taiwan in 2013, Malaysia in 2012, and Indonesia in 2011, all in collaboration with the World Organization of the Scout Movement/ Asia-Pacific Region.

With a diverse group of 29 participants coming from ten countries, the workshop was designed as a learning platform to encourage interaction and substantial sharing of best practices.

The gathering started on 2nd June with J. Rizal C. Pangilinan, Regional Director of APR, and Reg Williams, Chief Commissioner of Scouts Australia, giving a heartwarming welcome to participants.

"Sustainable Development through Scouting" was the workshop theme, aimed at stimulating and bringing Scout leaders together to exchange ideas on environmental education and foster new working knowledge for the implementation of the World Scout Environmental Program (WSEP).

The end goal of the workshop is to enhance the capacity of NSOs in providing quality education program by implementing the WSEP at national, local and community level.

APR strengthens World Adults In Scouting Policy

Sustained interest in the Adults in Scouting Policy is one of the main reasons why 41 participants are currently at the four-day APR Workshop on Adult Support being held at the Office of Council of Ministers in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. In-depth discussion covered the operational development of Scouting, with focus on support to NSOs and special projects. A great deal of time was devoted to the review of the APR Plan 2012-2015, with a decision to incorporate in all upcoming sub-committee meetings the drafting of objectives and action steps for 2015-2018.

During this meeting, Dr Chao and the guests visited Philippine Vice President Jejomar C Binay to present the Certificate of Green Jade National Flower Award from the Scouts of China.

Myanmar President leads revival of Scouting as Chief Scout

Scouting in Myanmar claims a moment in history when President U Thein Sein took oath as Chief Scout of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

The country had seen brilliant years of Scouting in the 1950s as the then Union of Burma Boy Scouts (UBBS) was one of the founding members of the Asia-Pacific Region in 1958. As history would have it, Scouting was inevitably dissolved in 1964.

In March 2013, President Thein Sein visited Canberra at the invitation of the Australian Government. Whilst in Canberra, he attended a function hosted by the Governor General, who is the Chief Scout of Australia. As the visit progressed, the President expressed a strong desire to develop Scouting in Myanmar.

In May 2013, the Education Ministry and YMCA hosted a meeting with a delegation of senior leaders in the Asia-Pacific Region (APR) representing

With the President's guidance and the support of the Asia-Pacific Regional office, volunteers are now drafting the constitution to put a formal Scout Association in place.

New Zealand Scouts achieve World Record

Confirmation has been received from the Guinness World Records that the most people wearing paper hats is 3,045 and was achieved by SCOUTS New Zealand (New Zealand) in Manfeild Park, Feilding, New Zealand, on 1 January 2014.

SCOUTS New Zealand broke this record at their 20th New Zealand Scout Jamboree, which occurs every three years, and includes scouts and leaders from New Zealand, Cook Islands, Australia, Korea, Solomon Islands, Indonesia, Tonga, Samoa and Hong Kong. The previous record was 2226.

The challenge was tackled at the jamboree site in Feilding, with 3054 Scouts taking part. The result was not confirmed by Guinness World Records until they had received documentation and video proof.

"This is an exciting result for our Scouts," said assistant camp chief-youth Hayley Thompson. "As Jamboree only occurs every three years, using this opportunity to attempt a new Guinness record is a real highlight."

Scouts of the World Award Discovery Workshop, Malaysia

With the attendance of 22 Rovers from four states, the workshop was held at the SEAMEO RECSAM in Penang, Malaysia. This is the first time that Persekutuan Pengakap Malaysia is organising a SWA Discovery. This workshop envisions a kick-start of the Scouts of the World Award in Malaysia.

Part of the workshop is an exploration to the Penang Inshore Fisherman Welfare Association (PIFWA), where the participants learned about the mangrove forest and its relation to the fisher folks. Participants also walked on the muddy swamp to plant mangrove seedlings. They visited the Taman Lumba Kuda Tzu Chi Recycling Education Center in Penang and joined the local community in sorting and dismantling recyclable materials.

The Scouts of the World Award Discovery prepares young people to do their Scouts of the World Voluntary Service. The Session includes communication, facilitation, leadership and project planning. Syd Castillo, Director of Youth Programme of the Asia-Pacific Regional Office, was invited as resource speaker.

More volunteers opening up for Scouting in Afghanistan

More adult volunteers in Afghanistan are opening up to Scouting as PARSA (Physiotherapy And Rehabilitation Support to Afghanistan) organized another Basic Unit Leaders Training Course for 34 adults from 17 to 23 May at the Scout Training Centre, in Kabul.

PARSA is playing a major role in the revival of Scouting in the country. Just recently, Afghanistan Scout Volunteers Society (ASVS), whose members are adult volunteers has been registered with the Ministry of Justice.

To inspire more adults joining Scouting, a Wood Badge was awarded to Akhtir Mohammad who is in-charge of Scouting in Nangarhar, one of the 34 provinces of Afghanistan with having over 9,700 Scouts (2,700 female).

She added, "PARSA is honoured to host this course and hear your voice. Your work will continue to be carried in all 34 provinces. Volunteers will be stepping forward to work for Afghanistan to take responsibility to build peace and stability."

WOSM's Position Paper: Unlocking our Potential (Circular no. 24/2014). The World Scout Committee, in its meeting held in March 2014, approved a Position Paper which gathers the main reflections held during the past 3 years in the Youth for Change working area. Through the paper "Unlocking our Potential", the World Scout Committee encourages the World Organization, at all levels, to make the best use of our diversified human potential (regardless of the members'ages), thus increasing Scouting's social impact.

Tell the Story! (at the World Scout Conference – Circular no. 25/2014). This is an exciting project of the World Scout Bureau in collaboration with the World Scout Foundation. NSOs are requested to appoint one delegation member to be the "Storyteller". There will be a team based in the exhibitions centre of the Conference ready to take the stories and help to tell them more widely.

Tasks for your NSO Storyteller:

- Bring along three stories of exceptional Scout heroes from your country
- stories that demonstrate how Scouts have impacted on the life of a single young person, a whole community, or even the whole country. No story is too big or too small

- each change is important
- when added together, they all contribute to a better World

Rehabilitation Projects for Haiyan Survivors

Six months after the devastating Typhoon Haiyan, the World Scout Foundation and a number of donor NSOs, Scout groups and individuals extended generosity to help the survivors. Here's an update from the recent visit to Tacloban City, headed by Mr Danilo Asiaten, member of APR Finance Sub-Committee:

Construction of Scout building. The project is under the Messenger of Peace and the Contract of Success has been signed. Around 30% of the project grant has been received. A location survey is being finalized between the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, Girl Scouts of the Philippines, and the Philippine National Red Cross.

Rebuilding of livelihood for Scout Families. The project has four major components: 1) rehabilitation of shelters; 2) establish a small-scale convenient (sari-sari) store; 3) provide locally-made motor boats; and 4) provide water buffaloes (carabaos) and basic agricultural needs. An ocular inspection was organized from 5-6 June 2014.

Disaster Preparedness Programme. The MoP Contract of Success has been signed and the project is yet to commence.

Ticket to Life. In addition to the existing Scout Troop in the Philippines, a new Scout Troop is planned to be organized in Tacloban City. This is pending due to the recent change of executive staff of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines in Tacloban City.

Messengers of Peace 2014

A very big leap has been achieved in the Asia-Pacific Region this 2014. In terms of membership, the APR has registered 17,473 Scouts and leaders. Service hours reached 539,847,476 and still counting. The number of projects is pegged at 1,196.

For 2014, these countries have or will be actively engaged in this global project: Indonesia, Philippines, Bangladesh, Japan, Korea, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.

APR Workshop on Fundraising

As of this writing, 19 Scout leaders from 8 NSOs (Cambodia, Fiji, Hong Kong, India, Maldives, Scouts of China, Sri Lanka and Macau) are attending the workshop. The workshop will be held at the headquarters of the Scout Association of Macau in Fortaleza de Taipa on 5-8 July 2014.

Workshop objectives are:

- To reinforce the principles of Fundraising
- To strengthen knowledge on various fundraising opportunities
- To share experiences of NSOs on Fundraising
- To equip participants with methods, techniques and tools for effective planning and implementation of fundraising projects.
- To draft fundraising projects based on the learnings during the Workshop

A meeting of the APR Finance Sub-Committee will follow on 6th July, where 10 members have confirmed to attend.

2014 APR Workshop on Communications and Marketing

This workshop has chosen three important angles for the overall development of Scouting: Understanding quality practices, Creating Impact and Growing Membership. These will be substantiated with the following objectives:

- Share and understand quality practices in communications and marketing by NSOs.
- Learn communication and marketing principles to create impact and grow membership.
- Share social media and marketing trends including updates on WOSM's significant advances in communications.
- Learn how to handle communication crisis.
- Discuss the Media Guideline for Large-scale Scouting events.

The Venue, Vila Putri" (Princess Villa) is a privately owned meeting facility in "Puncak" (Peak) area with elevation of around 650m to 1,400m surrounding Mount Gede and Mount Pangrango in Bogor regency, province of West Java.
