### Regional Chairman visits APR Support Centre

Regional Chairman Paul Parkinson visited the APR Support Centre for two days to meet the APR executives.

"My goal is to advance this region which has a great potential to meet the WOSM membership goal. I look forward to working with you and report the progress, achievements and successes of the region three years from now", he said.

APR Support Centre executives individually met with the Chairman to talk about organizational development and structures, communications, regional strategy, youth programme, adults in Scouting, management and finance, potential NSOs and special projects.

The Chairman stayed until the weekend to celebrate the Christmas "get together" with staff members and their families.

### APR fully supports BSP Strategy 2025

To pave the roadmap of Boy Scouts of the Philippines for 2025, key executives of APR Support Centre provided updates, perspectives and insights on the visioning process of Boy Scouts of the Philippines. The six-month intensive visioning kicked off in September 2015 with the introduction of WOSM Vision 2023 and APR Vision 2020 for national executives and regional directors who designed the roadmap for 2025, that now includes a new BSP Vision and five strategic priorities.

The second workshop involved 136 Council Scout Executives and key staff members to flesh out the strategy roadmap. BSP Director Roger Villa, project-in-charge, also invited resource persons from the Office of the President of the Philippines and relevant government offices to reinforce the strategy. Taking off the 4-day exercise were topics on image management from the perspective of governance and social impact (Luz Taray), Youth Programme and Adult Support (Syd Castillo and Thian Hiong Boon), and Volunteers and Professional Relationship (Paul Parkinson). The strategy will be presented to the BSP National Council at its annual conference in February 2016 for adoption.

### Disaster training series for Scouts reach the final leg

Concluding the series of disaster and risk reduction training that started in 2014, APR office in collaboration with Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP) wrapped up its final leg in southern Philippines with 30 Scouts and 29 Scout leaders from different provinces in Mindanao. The project is under the sponsorship of the World Scout Foundation.

Course Leader Broderick G. Train, with 18 years experience in disaster management, encouraged participants that learning the skills largely depends on creativity, analytical knowledge, and experience.

The two courses (for Scouts and Leaders) simultaneously happened at the BSP Camp Malagos, from 1-5 December 2015. Scouts and leaders had exercises on collapse structure search and rescue, vehicle extrication, sweep water rescue, basic life support and incident command system. The initiative is BSP's response to the Republic Act related to Disaster Risk Reduction and Management that introduces the principles of the Scout Emergency Service at home, school, neighbourhood and community.

#### **WOSM INITIATIVES**

#### **New Articulation for the WSB Offices**

WSB Circular No. 32/2015

At its March 2015 meeting in Kuala Lumpur, the WSC approved the new articulation for the WSB Offices as part of the move that reflects the true vision of "One WSB" and contributes to the successful delivery of the functions of the WSB as directed in Article XIX of the Constitution of WOSM. The Constitutional and legal name of each office remains unchanged. However, for the purpose of all non-legal communication, the new articulation is to be used on all digital and physical assets.

#### In summary:

- The two offices currently offering support at the global level to "World" initiatives:
- World Scout Bureau Kuala Lumpur Office -- where a majority of the operations, including the Secretary General's Office, were shifted from the former WSB Central Office in Geneva

### World Adults in Scouting Policy - Global Survey 2016

Circular Nº 33/2015

The World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) and National Scout Associations (NSA) have dedicated effort and resources towards promoting and supporting the implementation of the World Adults in Scouting Policy (WAISP). An urge for continuing that process has been made clear in different contexts.

This survey on Adults in Scouting aims at assessing the level of implementation of the WAISP, providing the basis for better supporting its implementation and further identifying specific areas suitable for improvement. The evidence acquired through the survey results will provide a basis for supporting the debate on the overall policy and/ or its specific dimensions, making projections and setting an action plan for the upcoming years.

This is a focused survey targeting National Scout Organizations and should be directly sent to the person in charge of the strategic implementation of the WAISP at the national level (i.e. Adults in Scouting/Adult Resources Commissioner/ Educational Methods Commissioner/ Training Commissioner). Only one submission per NSO is requested.

# World Scout Movement commits 1 billion hours of community service

Scott Teare, Secretary General of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), announced on behalf of the 40 million Scouts worldwide that the Movement will intensify its efforts in making the world a better place during the COP21 event on 9 December 2015, in Paris, France.

"I am proud to announce that 40 million Scouts across 223 countries and territories are committing a further 1 billion hours of community service as a contribution to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals – inspiring their communities, taking responsibility for shaping a better world. This is our Scout Promise," the Secretary General said.

Since 2012, Scouts around the world have already contributed more than 639 million service hours covering over six million community projects through activities and initiatives in the Better World framework, namely Messengers of Peace, World Scout Environment Programme and Scouts of the World Award. About 40% of the over 639 million service hours were coming out of environmental projects.

The World Organization of the Scout Movement and the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) issued a joint statement on 4 December calling on all parties to include young people in defining the solutions to the climate change issue given that they are the generation which will be affected. Both WOSM and WAGGGS are present and contributing to the COP21 debates in Paris.

During the COP21 event hosted by Corinne Lepage, in charge of a Mission for French President François Hollande on the Rights of Humanity, four Scouts representing the 40 million Scouts were given a "Youth Leadership Award for the Environment" recognising their contribution towards environmental and humanitarian relief efforts. In a video message, President Hollande congratulated the Scouts representatives for their leadership in environmental protection.

### Scouts New Zealand change of International Commissioner

After 30 years in the role as Scouts New Zealand International Commissioner George Fairbairn has retired. Over this time George has represented New Zealand Scouting on the world stage attending numerous Asia-Pacific Region and world conferences as head of the New Zealand delegation. In his role as International Commissioner, George has formed partnership and friends for life.

Stepping into the role as the new International Commissioner is John Saunders who has been involved in Scouting as a leader for 40 years in the Wellington area. John is ideally suited for the role as he is currently working as Director of Communications at Asia New Zealand Foundation, a not for profit organization and New Zealand's non-government authority on Asia.
