First Wood Badge Course launched for South Pacific Scout Associations

Nine Scout associations in the South Pacific took part in the very 1st Wood Badge Course at the Jean Murray National Training Center of Fiji Scout Association in Suva. Twenty-one unit leaders represented Fiji, Kiribati, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, Tonga and Vanuatu.

The Asia-Pacific Region Office organized the course under the funding of the Messengers of Peace (MoP) for the purpose of spreading Scouting across the Pacific. The training venue – JM Scout Centre – was recently renovated with the generous support of Boy Scouts of America.

The Minister of Youth and Sports, Viliame Naupoto, inaugurated the course on 22nd July. He said in his address that he was not able to enjoy Scouting in his childhood but is happy that his son is now a Scout who benefits from the Scouting program. He assured the support of the Ministry of Youth for the largest youth organization in Fiji and urged the participants to give 100% to what they are doing. He also toured the JM Scout Centre to see the upgraded facilities and find out the other needs of the centre.

Other prominent personalities were present, namely the Permanent Secretary for Youth and Sports Mr Joseva Sania, Permanent Secretary for Education Dr. Brij Lal who is also the Deputy Chief Commissioner, Deputy Chief Scout Chandra Shekar, President of Fiji Scout Association Abhay Nand and several other dignitaries and Scouts. Among the key Scout leaders present were the new Chairman of CSPSA Mr Sere Kala of Papua New Guinea and CSPSA Vice Chairman Mr Joe Billy Oge of Solomon Islands, Chief Commissioner of Kiribati Scout Association Mr. Kantera and National Secretary of Tuvalu Scout Association Ms. Sue.

Asia-Pacific Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed said that the Wood Badge course is a breakthrough in the history of CSPSA, a significant step in bringing quality to Scout training. He also explained the purpose of MoP and urged all participants to be messengers of peace.

A strong training team is supporting the course comprised of Vice Chairman of APR Adult Support Sub- Committee and National Training Commissioner Scouts Australia, Paul Parkinson, Alex Warriner who is the Director Training of Scouting New Zealand, and Prassanna Shrivastava of the Asia-Pacific Regional office. From the local side, Fiji Scouts National Training Commissioner Mahendra Prasad is leading the course.

Fiji Scouts has made steady progress in recent years to spread Scouting across the islands and is preparing to celebrate in a remarkable way Fiji's 100 years Scouting in 2014. Main highlight would be the National Scout Jamboree. With enormous effort, Scout membership has soared to over 5,000 in recent years.

CSPSA leaders meet to strengthen Scouting in the South Pacific

The Council of South Pacific Scout Associations (CSPSA) held its 7th Forum at a very impressive plenary hall of the South Pacific Commission Secretariat in Noumea. The Scouts and Guides New Caledonia hosted the forum on 16 July 2012.

Twenty two delegates comprising of Chief Commissioners and key leaders from ten countries in the Pacific attended the event, that includes Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiribati, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea (PNG), Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. This was the largest CSPSA gathering since it began its regular bi-annual meeting in 2004. Another ten observers from partner NSOs were in attendance including Scouts Australia, Scouts de France, Scouting New Zealand, and The Scout Association (UK).

Current Chairman and Chief Commissioner of Scouts and Guides of New Caledonia Mr. Roger Colot chaired the forum and welcomed at the opening the Honorable Minister of Youth and Sports Mr. Briault Gaby and several government representatives.

Major items on the agenda were the election of 2012-2014 office bearers with discussion on the achievements and challenges of CSPSA members. Mr. Sere Kala, Chief Commissioner of the Scout Association of Papua New Guinea was elected chairman of the council and Chief Commissioner of Solomon Islands, Mr. Joe Billy Oge, as vice-chairman. The council reaffirmed the offer of Papua New Guinea to host the next forum in mid 2014 in Port Moresby to be followed by the 2016 forum in Honiara, Solomon Islands.

As an ancillary event, a four-day workshop was set for 17-20 July in Noumea covering membership registration system, resources development, financial management, and NSO Constitution.

Several important events are lined up including a Centenary Jamboree in Fiji in August 2014, Soccer Tournament for Scouts Teams in Tonga in mid 2013, and Tuvalu will welcome the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge William and Kate in September 2012.

The workshop was directed by former Regional Scout Committee member Mr. John Ravenhall and supported by Reg Williams and Neville Tomkins from Scouts Australia, George Fairbairn and Ian Nicholson from Scouting New-Zealand, Nigel Hailey from The Scout Association UK, with Abdullah Rasheed and S. Prassanna Shrivastava from the World Scout Bureau/Asia-Pacific Region.

Mongolia holds the 1st International Scout Jamboree

After having organized four national Jamborees at regular intervals, the Scout Association of Mongolia (SAM) embarked on a more challenging course – an international Scout Jamboree. It is so far the largest camp gathering of Scouts with around 700 locals from all over Mongolia and some from over - seas with the support of local and international ISTs. The Jamboree is being held this 27th July to 3rd August at the Mongolia Scout Campsite located at a beautiful pine-clad valley.

A member of Parliament for Tuv province of Ulaanbaatar, Ms Oyungerel Tsedendamba, was the main guest at the opening ceremony who cited the vital contribution of Scouting to Mongolia's youth. Re - gional Director Abdullah Rasheed congratulated SAM and said that being a relatively young organiza - tion, there is so much to discover and learn about the uniqueness of Scouting in Mongolia. SAM Chief Commissioner Ms. Baigalma Lkhagvasuren, expressed her appreciation to all. The Jamboree Director, Adiyabold Namkhai and his team planned six activity bases, each with dozens of activities. High energy was visible among the participants as they performed the bases.

Representative from partner organizations such as UNICEF and the Nairamdal International Children's Centre visited the Jamboree and National Scout Council members are holding a special meeting there.

A back to back youth event is being organized for over 100 young adults, mostly from Korea. Among the guests are World Scout Committee Chairman Simon Rhee, Committee members Eric Khoo, Mari Nakano, APR Scout Committee Vice Chairman Prakorb Mukura, Goran Hagerdal and Abdullah Rasheed from the World Scout Bureau. High level delegations from ICCS, IUMS and other affiliated bodies of WOSM are also in attendance.

The president of the Korea Scout Association Dr. Jong Han Hahm and other key officials of KSA are attending the opening ceremony, while the Governor Wan Ju Kim of the Junbuk Province will host the welcome reception.

The 3rd World Scout Interreligious Symposium was held in Uganda, October 2009; the 2 nd World Scout Interreligious Symposium in Taiwan, May 2006 and the first World Scout Interreligious Symposium took place in Valencia, Spain, from 29 November to 2 December 2003.

Ocular visit to the proposed 2015 Asia-Pacific Region Scout Conference venue

Korea Scout Association (KSA) has confirmed its decision to bid for the 25 th Asia Pacific Regional Scout Conference in 2015 and proposes to host the event in Gwangju province, the 4th largest city in South Korea. Gwangju is also the venue for the 2015 World Universiade which will be participated by over 20,000 students, athletes and officials.

Regional Director Abdullah Rasheed and KSA officials had an ocular visit to the proposed site, the Kimdaejung Convention Centre (KDJ Convention Centre. Senior city officials joined the visiting team. The Convention Centre is named after the late Korean President Kim Dae Jung who hails from the same province. Gwangju can be reached by air, bus and train through the international airports in Incheon or Jeju.

The 2015 conference venue will be decided by the forthcoming regional scout conference in Dhaka in Bangladesh.

SAJ hosts the first Heads of Contingents Meeting for the 30th APR Jamboree

As host for the next Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree, Scout Association of Japan (SAJ) organized the first Heads of Contingents Meeting held at Yamaguchi, Japan from 28 th to 29 th July 2012.

The meeting mainly focused on the jamboree briefing and the jamboree site, attended by Australia, Malaysia and also from the World Scout Bureau represented by Executive Director, Strategy and Education Mr Göran Hägerdal and APR Director Syd Castillo. The Chairman of the Organizing Committee Mr. Kenji Horie, accompanied by Ms. Mari Nakano, Chairman of the 23rd Scout Jamboree welcomed the participants and the Department Heads who made their briefing.

Currently, over 350 have already registered in the early registration for the 30 th APR Jamboree and the 16th Nippon Jamboree from 1-7 August 2013. Next Heads of Contingents meeting would be in April 2013.

WSF Director amazed to see Scouts create many things from bamboo

World Scout Foundation Director John Geoghegan visited one of the Messengers of Peace (MoP) projects at the Mashudi Scout Campsite, West Java, around 150 kilometers from Jakarta, on 11 th July 2012. He was welcomed by the Vice Governor of West Java Province, Hon. Dede Yusuf, who is also the Chairman of Gerakan Pramuka West Java Provincial Headquarters.

Around the campsite, Scouts planted various species of bamboo seeds which are being chopped and brought to a factory inside the campsite area. Here, Scouts, ranging from 14 to 25 years old, are making bamboo crafts from woggle to different types of home furniture.

Inside the factory, Scouts showed Geoghegan some musical instruments made of bamboo. They also showed a traditional food in Indonesia with bamboo shoots as the major ingredient.

Project leader Fariana Riri Sastradiredja said "With this project, it is not only the Scouts learning and earning but also the people who live nearby." Sastradiredja added that Scouts and the villagers have learned the many benefits of bamboo, how it can be used for many things, and how the products can be sold at a price much higher than selling bamboo poles.

Kiribati Scout Leaders review Scouting progress

The series of Committee NSO visits (CNV) to 26 National Scout Organizations in the Asia-Pacific Region that started in 2008 concludes its full round with the Kiribati Scout Association (KSA). The visit took place on 10-11 July in Tarawa, the capital.

Over 25 Scout Leaders, including some commissioners and unit leaders of various Scout groups are meeting under the leadership of Chief Commissioner Mr. Kantera Baurerei Tebwebwe. The CNV Team is comprised of former Regional Scout Committee member John Ravenhall, Regional Governance task Force Chairman Alex Wong, with Abdullah Rasheed and S. Prassanna Shrivastava from the Regional office.

On the first day of the visit, local leaders shared the present status of Kiribati Scout Association on eight major indicators: Constitution, Mission and Vision, Management, Youth Program, Adult Resources, Relationships and Communication, Resources Development, Research and Development.

Representatives from the Ministry of Youth and the National Parliament attended the meeting, and expressed to support the KSA in strengthening the Scout Movement. Another meeting with young members of KSA was arranged on 11th July. The team also visited the headquarters of Kiribati Scout Association, still under construction but with the main structure already in place.

Nepal creates platform for young people

Scouting in Nepal advances as Nepal Scouts organized its first National Youth Forum from 29 th June to 2nd July 2012, creating a platform where young people can share their views on issues affecting them. Through youth forum, young adults of the National Scout Organizations have the opportunity to discuss and express their views on issues of interest to them, and at the same time developing their skills to strengthen their capacity in decision-making process.

Only 25 kilometers north-west of Kathmandu, the Kakani International Training Centre served as the meeting point of 55 young people, comprised of Rovers, Rangers, Scouts, Scout masters and Unit Leaders from 32 districts of Nepal.

Chief Commissioner Shree Ram Lamichhane inaugurated the event. Young adults discussion evolved on youth involvement, sectional scout programme, organizational structure, and the role of young people and adult leaders in community service, with the assistance of some key leaders serving as resource persons.— by Sudip Aryal, Honorary Correspondent
